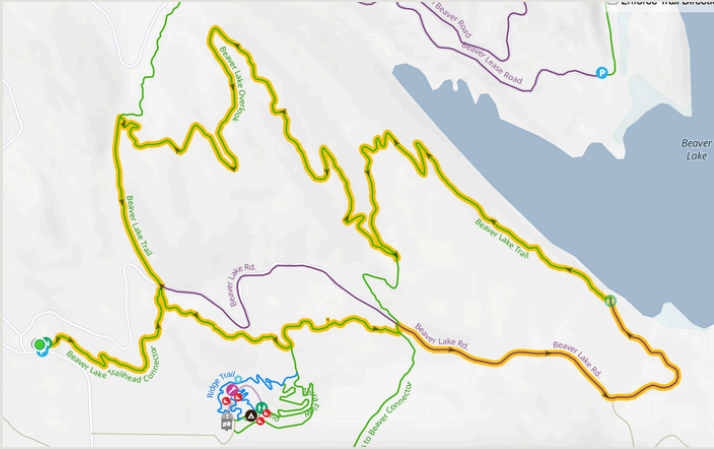

Trail Information

Trail distance: 6 miles

Trail type: lollipop loop

Total elevation gain: 600 ft.

Minimum trail width: 25 in.

Maximum trail grade: 4.5% or 16

Activities allowed: Biking, hiking

Trail surface: Natural, packed gravel on Beaver Lake Rd.

Maximum cross slope: 6% or 29 - there are straight sections of trail with a higher cross slope throughout as well as bermed switchbacks

Bridge crossings: There are no bridges on this trail

Stairs: There are no stairs along this trail

Man-made obstacles: There are no man-made obstacles along this trail

Switchbacks: This trail contains switchbacks with berms, which may be difficult for some aMTB to navigate. Some switchbacks have a wide enough base for the trail user to stay in the flat section, however some are more narrow and require the user to be on the berm (pictured right)



Pinch points: There is 1 point along this trail that may require assistance to navigate over and around. (pictured left) the distance to the left of the rock is approx. 15 in. and the rock has a drop on the other side that approx. 6-8 in.

Parking Information

Parking lot surface: Gravel

Distance from furthest parking spot to trailhead:
approx. 30 ft.

Total number of parking spaces: 11 spots in parking lot with plenty of street parking available

Availability of accessible parking: There is 1 accessible spot that is wide enough to allow for a foldout ramp (pictured right)



Bathrooms & Amenities

Bathrooms: There is 1 vault toilet at the trailhead with grab bars and a low threshold to enter. There is a second bathroom at the Beaver Lake boat launch, however it was not assessed on this day

Water availability: No water source along this route

Food availability: No food along this route

Picnic tables or benches: There are no picnic tables or benches along this route but there is an overlook platform and space to rest near the Beaver Lake boat launch (pictured left)

Shade levels: This trail is mostly sunny with some shady spots. Beaver Lake Rd. is in direct sun exposure
