Trail name: Lone Pine Trail to Western Larch Trail

Trail Information

Trail distance: 3 miles

Trail type: Lollipop loop

Total elevation gain: 480 ft.

Minimum trail width: 20 in.

Maximum trail grade: 14% or 4°

Bridge crossings: No bridge crossings on this trail

Man-made obstacles: The entry gate is the only obstacle you will encounter on this trail. There is 44 in. of clearance to get through the gate (pictured right)

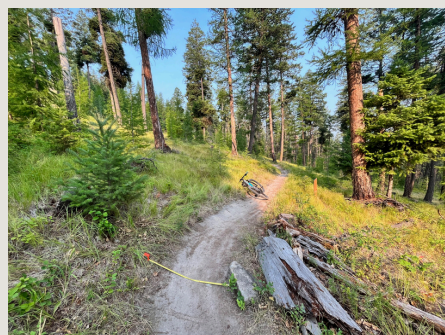
Stairs: There are no stairs on this trail

Switchbacks: The Lone Pine Trail does not have any switchbacks, but Western Larch is a winding trail with switchbacks. The turns are mostly flat, but you will encounter some roots and rocks throughout the turns

Activities allowed: Hiking, biking (select trails only), horseback riding

Trail surface: Natural

Maximum cross slope: Minimal, not measured



Note: The Lone Pine Trail is a wide and flat trail, created with the intent of being accessible. The Western Larch is a more traditional single track and is much narrower. There are some low stumps and rocks along the edge of the Western Larch trail that may limit who can ride on this trail (pictured left).

Parking lot surface: Paved

Total number of parking spaces: There is 1 accessible spots and 8 non-accessible spots

Distance from furthest parking spot to trailhead: 0.1 mi to the entry gate

Bathrooms & Amenities

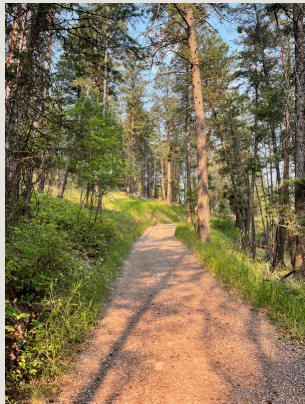
Bathrooms: There are no bathrooms at the lower parking area but there are facilities at the main lot at the top of the trail.

Water availability: No water source along this route

Food availability: No food along this route

Picnic tables or benches: There are benches along this trail, all are right along the trail and are easy to access (pictured right)

Shade levels: This trail is mainly shaded, with some spots of sun. There is good tree cover throughout the trail
